Pothole challenge tackled

Raubex, being one of South Africa's leading infrastructure development groups, has now extended its expertise to road infrastructure maintenance through the Pothole Initiative – One Street at a Time.

Focusing on helping to fix roads and streets that are disintegrating due to potholes, this project is part of Raubex's flagship Corporate Social Investment (CSI) initiatives.

Roadmac Surfacing, a Raubex subsidiary, has repaired numerous potholes in the Mangaung Metro municipal area. Work at all sites in the area has been done pro bono.

The Raubex Group is aware of its social responsibilities and believes it is crucial for businesses to play a positive role in the communities within which they operate.

Through the Pothole Initiative the group strives to promote the importance of infrastructure and its maintenance. The group believes infrastructure assets are the foundation of a country's economic development.

To date at least 180 reported cases of potholes in the Mangaung Metro Municipality have been seen to, and the Roadmac Surfacing team has set the benchmark of fixing a pothole within 72 hours.

The cost of repair ranges from R250,66 per pothole, costing the company a total of R835 000 to help address the challenge of potholes, which pose a serious threat to motorists. Not only can hitting one pothole seriously damage a vehicle – it can lead to deadly crashes.

Raubex prides itself on the work it does, but more than that: The group appreciates it more when they see their neighbours and communities thanking a company that has been around and will be for a long time to come.
